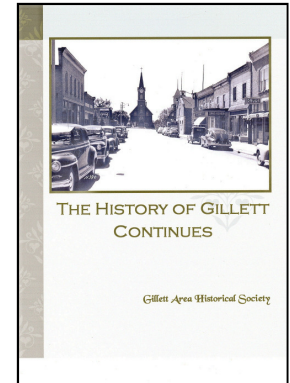


HISTORY OF GILLETT BOOK PUBLISHED

The Gillett Area Historical Society has gratefully received donations from Wells Fargo, Peshigo Bank, Kurt Darrow CPA, Arthur C. Gandt, Kuehl Funeral Home, Dr Steven Drake Family Eye Care, Spirits of Gillett, and others to help pay for the cost of publishing the book "The History of Gillett Continues". The book is approximately 140 pages with pictures. In 1962 Marie Darrow compiled and wrote "History of Gillett". This book includes her writings along with added information and updated items. New bits of history have also been added.

Part of the Preface of the book reads:

The stories you are about to read have been written long ago and updated several times"....
