Handmade Meaning explores the relationship between rarely seen Victorian "fancywork"—hand–painted china, hair wreaths, and fine embroidery—from historical societies and museums across Wisconsin, objects made by people active in the current DIY movement, and work by contemporary Wisconsin artists who use craft processes and materials. The exhibition is a collaboration between the James Watrous Gallery, the Wisconsin Decorative Arts Database, and the UW–Madison Dept. of Art History.
