Covering the legal basis for commission operation, this topic includes procedural due process, takings, appeals, ethics, property rights, economic hardship, and more. Extra emphasis can be given to different areas.

Standards & Guidelines

This component gives participants an understanding of the relationship between Federal Standards and local design guidelines that they need to use these essential tools most effectively.

Public Support

Historic preservation commissions regularly get bogged down in the day-to-day issues of reviewing applications and forget that they are public servants who should enthusiastically promote local preservation. Participants learn how to engineer local support for designations, survive unpopular decisions, and deal with reluctant elected officials.

Hands on Design

The "Sports and Games" of CAMP, this session teaches commission members and staff how to view change before it occurs in historic districts, and provides opportunities to learn from instructors and from each other in a lively and fun format.
