

On display for the first time outside the attic at 1108 East Fourth Street, where they were stored for generations, a new book, <u>American Style and Spirit</u>, presents a Marshfield family's collection of more than 200 garments and accessories. Each object has been beautifully preserved and is complemented by archival objects, family photographs, and thousands of letters. Following years of research, Bradbury and Maeder have uncovered the once-hidden stories behind three generations of Roddis family garments spanning nearly 150 years. In this lecture, they will discuss the background behind this entrepreneurial family, what their clothes tell us about them, and an explanation of how they shaped the collection found in the Roddis house attic into the subject of an award-winning book, acclaimed on both sides of the Atlantic.

Areas of interest to be covered during the lecture include the turn of the twentieth century, the 1920s, the Depression, the 1950s, business practices, women's cultural and civic activities, shopping, home sewing, travel, and of course, many fabulous clothes.
