Mannequin Making Workshop

Would you like to display your institution's historic clothing on custom-made mannequins? Then join us, for a one day workshop in mannequin carving at the La Crosse County Historical Society.

This course will focus on learning to make a custom mannequin for an historic costume. Participants will study how changing fashions in the female silhouette affects the way a costume appears on exhibit; as well as the appropriate archival materials to use with museum costumes. Participants learn the process of carving polyethylene foam to create custom forms, and may bring one dress, or skirt and bodice, from their collection for their mannequin.
