



The Future of Israel:

Democracy or Apartheid?

March 5 - 7pm

What happens to the Palestinians who live in Israel? Israel calls itself a democracy - yet Palestinians inside Israel, who are citizens of Israel, are treated differently. What causes such inequality? What stands in the way of change? More importantly, what are the implications for Israel's future? This is a unique piece of the Palestinian-Israeli puzzle not often spoken about.

Dr. David Wesley, an Israeli anthropologist originally from Michigan, has lived in Israel since 1955. His 2006 book "***State Practices and Zionist Images***," recently re-released in paperback, has been heralded as "the most important book to date on Israeli anthropology. During David's 3 month nation-wide book tour he will be speaking at Harvard, Fordham, NYU, Georgetown, U of Virginia, U of Chicago, U of Michigan, UWEC, Berkeley, UCLA, and others. He is joined on this tour by his wife, Elana, a major Israeli peace activist.

Only members of the local peace and justice networks and progressive spiritual groups are invited to attend this small, intimate conversation with David and Elana.
